Indiana has 86 degree-granting higher education institutions, which represent 1.8% of all such institutions in the United States. These institutions enrolled a total of 429,386 students as of fall 2015 (369,199 of which are studying at the undergraduate level and 60,187 at the graduate level). The fall 2015 figure is a decrease of 20,261 students (or -4.5%) from the number enrolled in the fall of 2012.


Among the total student body, 123,020 (101,255 undergraduates and 21,765 graduate students) were taking at least one course at a distance. This is 28.7% of the enrolled student body, which is lower than the national average rate of 29.7%. The number of students taking distance education courses in the state increased by 2,297 (or 1.9%) between fall 2012 and fall 2015. This is lower than the national level of growth of 11.0%.

53,836 students in Indiana are taking all of their courses at a distance, made up of 37,387 undergraduates and 16,449 graduates. This represents 12.5% of all students enrolled in the state, a rate that is lower than the national average of 14.3%. A total of 33,900 (or 63.0% of these exclusively online students) live in Indiana, the remainder come from outside of the state. This rate is higher than the national in-state average of 55.1%.


The number of students that take any of their courses on campus, including those who take all of their courses on campus and those who take a mix of on-campus and distance courses, is 375,550, or 87.5% of the total student enrollment in Indiana. This number represents a decrease in proportion on campus from the four years prior (88.0% from 395,573 students in 2012). The -0.5% rate is a smaller change than the national 1.7% decrease.


Overall and Distance Enrollment - 2015






Distribution of Distance Student Enrollment
